REACH Workshop

Final countdown to pre-registration and registration of chemicals

Companies can continue manufacturing, importing or using chemicals after 1 December 2008 only if these chemicals have been preregistered (or registered)!

Many companies are not aware of their potential obligations under REACH, as manufacturer, importer or user of chemicals or articles, especially if they do not directly belong to the chemical sector.

REACH: "no data, no market"

Under REACH, the new chemicals regulation of the European Union, companies must pre-register chemical substances between 1 June and 1 December 2008 if they want to benefit from staggered registration deadlines (2010, 2013, 2018).

If a manufacturer or importer of a chemical fails to pre-register by 1 December 2008 he **cannot continue manufacturing or importing** it until he has submitted a full REACH registration dossier.

Users of chemicals cannot continue using substances which have not been pre-registered or registered by their supplier.

The Workshop

The workshop aims to alert companies that they should not miss the pre-registration "window". It will explain the key elements of pre-registration and registration under REACH, focusing on practical aspects for companies to comply. It will also provide up-to-date information on the REACH guidance documents and tools to support companies, and discuss what is done or can be done to raise awareness of these topics.

Target audience

- Companies having potential obligations under REACH: manufacturers and importers of chemicals, users of chemicals, as well producers, importers and suppliers of articles

- Actors with key role in the implementation of REACH, especially in raising awareness and informing or assisting companies regarding REACH, e.g. industry associations or public bodies.
